Delta Dental Requirements for Dependents

In order for a child age 19-25 to be eligible for coverage, we must document that all three of the folling conditions are being met annually. Your child must be:

- A full-time student in post-secondary education
- Single (not married)
- Claimed by you as a dependent on your Federal Income Tax return.

At age 25, the coverage for qualifying students will end at the end of the calendar year in which your child turns 25.
